### **OTC**

Approximately 13 students participated. We used standardized patients and pharmacist preceptors and 4<sup>th</sup> years as judges. Food was provided.

### **PIC**

15 students participated. We had pharmacists and faculty as judges and participants loved having standardized patients. Students found the case very difficult. Food was provided.

### **Compounding competition**

A U of T favorite! The lab was full, with 16 teams, food was provided and the event was very successful.

### **SLC**

Obtaining entries was very difficult again this year as the deadline needed to be extended despite starting promotion earlier this year. We ended up with 5 entries in total.

### **Mock OSCE**

Another U of T favourite event – we had 47 volunteers, 56 participants and a waiting list approximately 65 students long. We had 7 original cases and feedback from participants and volunteers alike was very favourable.

### **PDW 2012**

PDW was greatly enjoyed by our students – most of our students completed our U of T educational requirements and received our conference subsidy to an amount of approximately \$120 each.

### **Teva Leadership Seminar**

We had 40 students attend the Teva leadership seminar held by David Windross at the Marriott Courtyard and feedback was very positive from students.

CAPSI charity week occurred during the month of March. During the week we fundraised for our charity, The Childhood Cancer foundation, through a raffle (restaurant gift cards, a digital picture frame and an iPod nano as prizes), and an NCAA March Madness Basketball pool and a bake sale with a cupcake competition. We wrote a cheque of \$1300 for the Foundation. Earlier in the year at U of T's Charity Week, CAPSI reps hosted the annual prof auction which raised close to \$4000 for class and CAPSI Charities.

### **PAW**

CAPSI and local events directors organized and co-hosted our first annual Mr. Pharmacy pageant and raised over \$1400 for the Canadian Testicular Cancer foundation

### **Community Outreach Programs**

Outreach Programs were not very successful this year. Only 1 presentation was made for Operation wash-up, and none for Operation Allergy or for Sexual Education..

### **Elections**

Alysha Prata was elected as the new junior CAPSI rep and Wilson Cheng as our junior IPSF representative. Several CAPSI local council members decided to run for CAPSI local council again for the following year, indicating that overall he experience with CAPSI local council was a very positive one

## **Université Laval**

**Allergy activity:** I had 4 classes, Catherine had around 8 classes. A great success. I did an experiment and presented the activity to older kids (3rd-4th year of elementary) and it was an excellent experience. Will be done again next year.

**Yearly symposia:** It was about the coast-to-coast subject and the presenter worked at the OPQ (our provincial pharmacists association). He did a review of the job of pharmacy in all of Canada's provinces and did a focus on Quebec and the upcoming new law 41 which will add responsibilities to Quebec's pharmacists.

**CPhA presentation:** Denis Villeneuve came and did a lunch-and-learn presentation, presenting the CPhA to students. We are looking forward to promoting CPhA and raise ULaval's membership next year. The rebate and eventual translation of Therapeutics Choices in french might be a good argument to convince our students.

### Finance Officer

1. Fiscal year of April 1, 2012 to March 31, 2011 ended well with a surplus of approximately \$13,000.00. Expenses for both CPhA 2011 and PDW 2012 came in just under budget of \$20,000.00 each. Membership fees collected were similar to previous years and as expected were approximately \$35,000. Profits from PDW 2012 were higher than expected by about \$40,000 as actual profits were about \$60,000. Agenda ad revenues were also higher than expected with total revenue being approximately \$14,000.00.
2. In the coming year, the budget will be similar to last year. Projected costs for CPhA 2012 are \$1100 for executive members (hotel + travel + registration) and Sr. Reps (travel + registration) and for PDW 2013 will be about \$1000 per executive member and Sr. Rep. PDW 2013 and CAPSI club are not expected to bring in as much revenue as in the last fiscal year. We allotted significantly more funds (\$4000) for legal fees this year, as there have been changes to non-profit status for the Canada Revenue Agency that may require the services of a lawyer.
3. We are still lacking sponsorship for the PIC competition (\$3500) and the Award of Professionalism (\$1500)

### IPSF Liaison

Cassandra will be attending World Congress

Mitch our Senior IPSF representative from Toronto is also going and will attend some meetings with Cassandra as an Official Delegate. Insaf the IPSF representative from Edmonton has also been invited to be an Official Delegate.

We did a vote with IPSF local representatives on the IPSF Health Campaign topic for next year to try and get them more involved. This will be discussed later in our agenda.

Health Campaign Award applications were due yesterday and are in so that will be discussed on Friday
