

The year ended with the creation and implementation of the Bridging the Gaps Fund, funding our 1st initiative through this community endowment, and welcoming the University of Ottawa into our CAPSI family!

Welcome UOttawa!

The University of Ottawa is the first school to offer the PharmD program in French outside of Québec. The goal is to provide high-quality healthcare for minority francophone communities! The first class consists of 57 students and will graduate in 2027. They are excited to carve the way for the newest pharmacy program in Canada!

- Established the **Bridging the Gaps Fund**, a community endowment Fund.
- Return of in-person competitions and activities including **Professional Development Week 2023** in Saskatoon.
- We welcomed Canada's 11th School of Pharmacy, the University of Ottawa! They elected their first CAPSI Representatives, Alexia Laurin and Mélisande Logelin.
- Advocated for school specific mental health recommendations and improved policies surrounding bereavement days.
- O5 CAPSI National successfully ran our largest **mentorship program** to date.
- Continue to work with CPhA to advocate for pharmacy school to be included in the **Student Loan Forgiveness program.**
- O7 Successfully advocated for **additional in-person MCQ spots** to be added in Winnipeg for the May 2023 PEBC exam.
- CAPSI National developed and launched our **new membership** portal, CAPSI members corner!
- CAPSI National acquired **several new membership benefits** including Focus Mental Wellness, Pyrls, GoodLife Fitness, and Rx Billing Genie.
- CAPSI National **strengthened our relationships** with both current and new partners including AFPC, CCAPP, CCCEP, CPhA, CSHP, IPPC, NPAC, and NAPRA.



IPSF Wrapped

- CAPSI won the **Sidney J. Relph Award** at the 68th World Congress in Bali, recognizing the Best Member Organization in IPSF.
- O2 CAPSI alumnus, **Yifan Zhou**, was elected **President-Elect of IPSF Executive Committee.**
- CAPSI students attended the 68th World Congress in Bali, Indonesia.
- CAPSI alumnus, **Sofiya Terekhovska**, was **appointed to the IPSF Advisory Board.**
- Vampire Cup was restarted by Nicole Bakowski in 2023 after being on hold due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Farah Hadji was an IPSF Delegate for UNFCC COP28 in Dubai, United Arab Emirates.
- 7 CAPSI students participated in the Student Exchange Program.
- 5 international students came to Canada to participate in the Student Exchange Program.





ADVOCACY

CAPSI is the voice of over 4000 pharmacy students across the country. We address local and national issues and advocate for our profession with stakeholders.

Under the leadership of Marianna Pozdirca and Lynn D'Souza, CAPSI's advocacy strategy shifted to focus on school-specific initiatives and concerns. We created a statement regarding student bereavement during clinical rotations, which has been publicly released and directly sent to relevant stakeholders, including CCAPP.

In collaboration with CPhA, CAPSI has continued our efforts to engage government officials in a conversation surrounding the inclusion of pharmacy graduates who work in rural and remote communities in the Student Loan Forgiveness Program, similar to graduates of medicine and nursing professions. Additional efforts for Student Loan Forgiveness this year have included providing students with the opportunity to write and/or sign letters to send to their local MPs, as well as starting to form a website and organizing a webinar related to the initiative.

ADVOCACY

CAPSI also supported local representatives in carrying out their own advocacy initiatives, which have included collaborating with the University of Toronto to implement a Fall Reading Week and communicating with the University of Ottawa students to advocate for refining their new curriculum to support student wellness wherever possible.

Future initiatives, led by Nolan Barkhouse, will include releasing a statement in collaboration with IPPC regarding time off placement to pursue advocacy initiatives, conversing directly with MPs about Student Loan Forgiveness upon their replies to the letters we have sent, collaborating with nursing and medical student associations, and organizing educational webinars (including an upcoming topic related to negotiations in pharmacy organized with CPhA).




