7. PDW 2020 Update

E. Roy St-Pierre

E. Roy St-Pierre highlighted position changes within the PDW PC.

Hotel contract will be signed next week for January 8th-11th 2020 at the Sheraton.

A Mew asked whether flight discounts would incur as this year did.

- P. Thabet answered that it has not yet been established whether this will continue. He suggested that this will be discussed at another CAPSI meeting.
- D. Huot informed council that the logo and promotional video are well under work. Additionally, lists of potential speakers and sponsorship packages are both on scheduled to be completed before the end of May.
- P. Thabet reminded that sponsorship packages and script for the promotional video must be reviewed by executives first.

- P. Thabet asked if a trip could be funded retroactively. In example, if a person chooses to attend CPhA, but keeps reimbursement for PDW, but then cannot attend PDW, can they get reimbursement instead for CPhA.
- S. Barillaro confirmed this could work well.
- T. Sanders suggested that the Finance Committee could review these exceptional requests.
- D. Moulton informed that this can be adjusted based on financial positives throughout the year. He understood that what's been suggested seems fair.

A Mew queried whether an AirBnB or hotel room would be an option.

T. Sanders informed that hotel rooms have already been scheduled with CPhA, but the room rate is lower than last year.

9. GST/HST registration for Non-for-profit organizationsBackground: CAPSI's new accounting firm has advised us to register and take advantage of GST/HST registration for the coming fiscal year. S. Barillaro has been working to provide them with the necessary documentation.

10. PDW 2018 – Edmonton

Background: D. Moulton closed the books on PDW 2018 just today and found that PDW 2018 did incur profit (\$51,746.29).

11. Update of IPSF Liaison/SEO Position T. Sanders/G. Anhoury-Sauvé/J. Yu Background:

After discussion with the current IPSF Liaison and SEO position holders, it has been discussed that these positions may benefit from a repositioning of duties. Currently, the IPSF Liaison promotes and coordinates all IPSF initiatives, trains the local representatives, and also coordinates the incoming student exchange program (SEP) participants. The SEO currently coordinates the outgoing SEP participants as well as the SEP Selection Committee. While coordinating the incoming SEP participants is ideal to prepare the IPSF Liaison position holder for their role as SEO, and was the historical intention for the ordering of such a duty, it is also very demanding and can be overwhelming for the IPSF Liaison in this new role. Therefore, we would like to propose that the duties be remodelled as follows:

IPSF Liaison -- Promotion of IPSF initiatives, learning the intricacies of IPSF, and training IPSF local reps

SEO – Coordinate incoming & outgoing SEP participants, and coordinate SEP selection committee

The above changes would allow the incoming IPSF Liaison to learn more about IPSF and gain an appreciation of the vast organization that is IPSF before coordinating SEP participants. Should we vote to accept the shift in framework duties, the following amendments to our constitution would need to be approved:

- P. Thabet suggested that these students are indeed useful, and that C. Sehgal's point does deserve discussion, but is perhaps not relevant to this point at this time.
- K. Tress suggested that this point of discussion will be added to the CPhA agenda.

12. Sponsorship in Toronto

N. Gajaria/R. Anisman

Background:

A new legislation change in Ontario (Health Sector Payment Transparency Act), is calling for more stringent reporting of pharmaceutical company sponsorship to the government. Our faculty has proposed that the Undergraduate Pharmacy Society partner with them to make it easier for them to report sponsorship information, and to increase buying power. Currently at UofT, our student External Affairs representatives are in charge of recruiting sponsors.

We wanted to know:

- 1) Do any of your schools currently use the faculty as opposed to student societies to approach potential sponsors? What is the structure like in terms of receiving money from the faculty?
- 2) What pros/cons do you see with this approach?

School	Sponsorship
UBC	All organizations within pharmacy in BC search out for their own funding and sponsorships. There is no discussions about partnering in sponsorship efforts and no foreseeable talks
UofA	Recruitment of sponsors is separate from Faculty involvement. Student society (APSA Fundraising Director) approaches sponsors
Sask	Student society approaches sponsors - communications position on SPNSS that contacts sponsors. CAPSI local council will contact sponsors as needed for specific events (e.g. Mr. Pharmacy). The independence of this approach is of benefit.

Manitoba	Student society approaches sponsors (typically only for specific events)
Waterloo	Faculty deals with sponsorships, only on occasion will they direct specific companies to our undergraduate society. The sponsorship the school receives is used for conference reimbursement ("Student Success Fund"). Our undergraduate society puts out a "Do Not Approach" List as per the faculty's request. Student clubs like CAPSI have the opportunity to contact potential sponsors that are not currently on the list.
Toronto	Student External Affairs Representatives (part of the Undergraduate Pharmacy Society) approach sponsors
UdeM	Student society (corporative officer and assistant-corporative officer) approaches sponsors. The Faculty and the student association do not really communicate about the sponsors.
Laval	Student society approaches sponsors. Pharmaceutical companies are forbidden by a new law (law 90). We mostly get our sponsors from financial institutions/cabinets.
Dal	Student societies approach sponsors - mainly driven by our Dalhousie Student Pharmacy Society.
MUN	Student societies approach sponsors PRN and collect all money independently. However, we are in contact with the school regarding who sponsors us, how much, etc.

UofA	Yes! We had a community pharmacist, a pharmacist from a diabetic nephropathy clinic, a nurse & a registered psychologist.	No changes to the case. We just selected a few of the guiding questions to use because we only had a 50 minute block.	We found this topic very accessible to students of all years, even though diabetes isn't taught until third year. We really focused on the interprofessional aspect of the case rather than the therapeutics.
Sask	Yes!	No changes were made, however not all questions were utilized for sake of time.	The topic was a great idea to find a HCPs that were specialized as CDE but not in the traditional HCP roles. Additionally beneficial as we have joint Pharmacy and Nutrition college.

Further to this, this gives enables CAPSI to offer opportunities for current pharmacy students and CAPSI members to mentor possible future pharmacy students/pharmacists.

- P. Thabet suggested that the title of the individual could be "student wellness officer" which could encompass other things beyond mental health.
- T. Sanders asked for any input to be sent to preselect@capsi.ca for the incoming preselect and Constitutional Review Committee.
- J. Kwon suggested it would be a good idea to compile the resources available at all schools before initiating a discussion on mental wellness.
- P. Thabet reminded that we have existing resources available on the CAPSI website available at this time.
